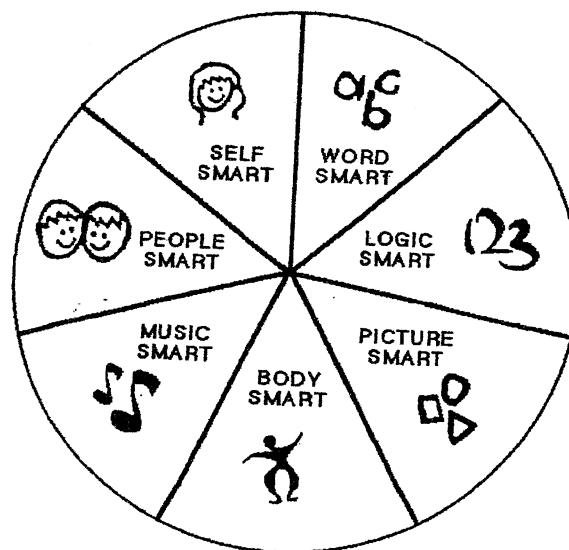


Multiple Intelligences Overview

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With a classroom of different learners I try to have different projects available to promote different learning styles. I use the Multiple Intelligences Theory* to guide the projects. The seven intelligences are seven different ways to demonstrate intellectual ability. The diagram below illustrates the seven intelligences.



During the reading group time of the day, students in groups read three literature books, one at a time. They are required to finish an assignment related to each literature book and then have a choice to complete an additional project (10). All students will read the three books by the end of the unit.
